

## 2026 Ladies Season Games

1. All women members of Crown Isle are eligible to play in these games
2. Members may register through Golf Genius 30 days before each game. **Registration closes at 10 am on the Thursday prior.**
3. Should you wish to register for a Tuesday game after the registration closes on Thursday, you can email CILCMatchPlayandTournaments@gmail.com, and if there is an open spot on the tee sheet, your name can be added, **HOWEVER**, you would not be part of the Tuesday game of the day.
4. If you sign up for recreational play, you still must submit your signed/attested score card at the end of the round; however you will not be eligible for points or prizes associated with that day's game.
5. Score are required tote enters into Golf Genius during the golf round. Additionally, signed/attested score cards must be turned in immediately following play to the designated box in the Ladies Locker Room. The scores from Golf Genius will then be uploaded to Golf Canada. You will not enter your own scores in Golf Canada for these games.
6. Score cards will be prepared in advance of play. On the day of play, please pick your score card (or your team's score card) from the Pro shop or Starter's hut. Please take note of your handicap as it is shown on the score card to ensure it is current and correct.
7. For almost every game, individual scores are to be recorded. Even most of the team games, except as noted below, are based on individual scores that are eligible for posting to Golf Canada for handicap purposes.
8. There are only three games this season that are not eligible for posting to Golf Canada for handicap purposes. These games are: Las Vegas Scramble, Fairways and Greens, and Three Clubs and a Putter.
9. Points awarded on Tuesday games are tracked and totalled at the end of the season. The monetary value of the points will be based on the Ladies annual budget.
10. On any day that you play in the Game of the Day, Golf Genius will enter your individual score (where applicable) into the year-long "**Ringer Board**" competition. A "Ringer Board" in golf is used to accumulate a player's best score for every hole during a season. For example, if you score a 7 on Hole #1 on day one and then on another day you score a 4 on that hole, the 7 would be deleted and replaced with the 4. If you then score a 5 on Hole #1, the 4 would remain. At the end of the season the Ringer Board shows the best score for each hole played during the season. CILC will award prizes to the top three players on both the Gross Ringer Board and the Net Ringer Board. Golf Genius automatically takes into account your handicap current to the day of play when it enters scores into the Net Ringer Board.
11. In most cases, ties will be resolved using USGA retrogression. In a few cases, ties will be paid out.
12. Every player who has won 1st Low Net or 1st Low Gross in an eligible Tuesday game during the season is qualified to compete for the **Ace of Aces** Low Net trophy. Players will be notified if they qualify. On the day of the Ace of Aces tournament, the "Aces" will go out first in the Draw. All players will play for Stableford points that day. "Aces" are competing for the Ace of Aces trophy as well as standing in the game of the day.
13. Where Stableford points are used in scoring, points are allocated as follows: Net Eagle = 4 points; Net Birdie = 3 points; Net Par = 2 points; Net Bogey = 1 point; Double Bogey or worse = 0 points.
